NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given pursuant to M.G.L. c. 30A, §2, that the Department of Public Health will hold a public hearing on amendments to the following regulation: 105 CMR 140.000, *Licensure of Clinics* and 105 CMR 145.000, *Licensing of Out-of-Hospital Dialysis Units in Massachusetts*.

The amendments to these regulations, done in compliance with Executive Order 562, remove outdated language and unnecessary requirements, update the regulations to comply with state and federal laws, align requirements with other department regulations, and remove duplicative state review where necessary.

The public hearing will be held on Tuesday, October 25, 2016, at 9:30 a.m., in **Room 417, 239 Causeway Street, Boston, Massachusetts 02114**. Speakers are requested to provide a copy of their oral testimony. The Department encourages all interested parties to submit testimony electronically to the following address: Reg.Testimony@state.ma.us. Please submit electronic testimony as an attached Word document or as text within the body of an email and type "Clinic Licensure Regulations" or "Dialysis Unit Regulations" in the subject line. All submissions must include the sender's full name and address. The Department will post all electronic testimony that complies with these instructions on its website. All written or oral comments submitted to the Department may be posted on the Department's website and released in response to a request for public records. All testimony must be submitted by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 28, 2016.
